**E** cuador News is the first Ecuadorian newspaper printed in the United States.

It was founded on March 1996 and is the newspaper of the Ecuadorian community abroad.

Ecuador News appeared as bi-monthly magazine. This change reflected the enormous growth of the newspaper, thanks to the overwhelming support of readers and advertisers especially of Ecuadorian and Latin American origin and multinational companies that already began to appear.

On September 4, 2001 the launch of Ecuador News as weekly newspaper was held at the Consulate General of Ecuador in New York.

Ecuador News is circulated every Wednesday and the closing day are on Tuesdays.



## Percentage of Ecuadorian Population of the United States Living in New York, New Jersey, Florida, California, Connecticut and Illinois, 1980 - 2008


